Smoking Dominates Oscar "Best Picture" Nominees

<u>Peer-reviewed research</u> shows exposure to tobacco imagery can make young people up to three times more likely to start vaping nicotine.



8 out of 10

"Best Picture" nominees in 2025 feature characters who smoke, and 3 are youth-rated (PG/PG-13). However, well-established research shows that smoking on screen influences young people to start smoking and vaping.

And it's not just background characters. Oscar favorites and social media stars popular with youth are normalizing smoking on screen:

Timothée Chalamet, a favorite to win "Best Actor," smokes in "A Complete Unknown" Selena Gomez - the most followed woman on Instagram - sleeps next to an ashtray in "Emilia Pérez," the most nominated film



Mikey Madison, a favorite to win "Best Actress," smokes in "Anora"



Tobacco in movies is on the rise, according to the

most recent annual analysis:

In 2023, the number of movies depicting tobacco increased for the first time since 2020.
